To the justices of Southampton, sitting in chancery  
humbly complaining, shews to the court your  
orator Edward W. Tyler executor of Henry Adams  
deceased.

That a certain Brunell Rawlings  
of the said county of Southampton on the  
1<sup>st</sup> day of March 1798 executed a bond to Josiah  
Vick for the sum of eighty four dollars and  
sixty six cents, conditioned, to pay him \$47.33.  
That the said Vick paid the said bond for valuable  
consideration to your court, as administrator  
of Henry Adams, without a written agreement.  
That in consequence of this, yr. orator instituted  
a suit at law on the said bond in the name  
of the said Josiah Vick. That the said Vick  
upon discovering that the suit was so brought  
directed the clerk to dismiss the said suit.  
That your orator is therefore forced to resort  
to this court, as he has no remedy at law,  
In tender consideration whereof  
he solicits the aid of this court.

To the end therefore  
he prays that the said Brunell Rawlings  
be made dependant to this bill of complaint,  
and that he may on oath fully, true and perfect  
answer make to all and singular the allegations  
aforesaid, and that as fully as if the same were  
here repeated, and be thereto particularly interrogated.  
He prays that the court will decree that the said  
Brunell Rawlings pay to him the said sum of  
\$47.33 with interest from the 1<sup>st</sup> 14<sup>th</sup> day of March  
1798 until paid, or that yr. worship will  
make such other order or decree in the  
premises for yr. orator relief as may seem  
just & equitable -

Know all men by these presents that I Burwell Rawlings  
of the county of Southampton, am held & firmly bound unto Josiah Vick  
of the same county, in the Just & full sum of Eighty four  
Spanish milled dollars & Sixty six Cents; to be paid unto the said Josiah  
Vick his certain Attorney, his heirs, executors, Adm<sup>rs</sup> or Assigns,  
& the payments whereof I bind myself my heirs, executors  
& Adm<sup>rs</sup> firmly, by these presents, sealed with my seal  
and dated this first — day of March 1798

The Condition of the above obligation is such that if  
the above bound Burwell Rawlings do and shall well & truly  
pay or cause to be paid unto the said Josiah Vick his certain  
Attorney, his heirs, executors, Administrators or Assigns, the  
Just & full sum of Forty seven — like dollars &  
thirty three Cents; that then the above obligation  
to be void or else to remain in full force & Virtue
