plaining sheweth unto your Worships, your  
Petitor Williamson.

That William Williamson  
his father departed this life intestate or or  
about the day of            A D one thousand  
seven hundred and            That in  
his life time and at the time of his decease,  
he was lawfully possessed of a considerable  
estate. That letters of administration  
upon his said estate were by the court of  
this county, granted to William Boykin.  
That the said administrator has never returned  
to this court an inventory or appraisement  
of the said estate as the law requires, nor  
has he ever paid to your Petitor his just  
portion of the same.

In tender consideration  
whereof and too as much as your Petitor  
is aggrieved at law, he solicits

of your worships.

To the end therefore he prays  
that the said William Boykin may be  
made Dependant to this bill of complaint  
and that he may full true and perfect  
answers upon his corporal oath make  
all and singular the allegations herein  
contained and that as fully as if the same  
were here repeated, and be thereto particu-  
larly interrogated, and more especially  
that he set forth, if he did not administer  
upon the estate of William Williamson.  
If the said estate was not a considerable  
one, of what it consisted? how much of  
it was sold, and for what? where is the  
money arising from the sale? and when  
is the residue of the property? If there were  
any debts due from the estate and to the  
estate, how many and to what amount.  
If he has ever paid any part of the estate or  
the money arising from the sales to your  
what show much. He lastly

prays that your Worships will decree to him  
so much of the estate or money arising from  
the sales if any, as shall be unaccounted  
for by the said William Boykin or make  
such other or further order or decree in  
the premises for his relief as may seem just  
and equitable.


