Wife to John Hargrave & Patience Vick
children of Lydia Vick &c

That Jesse Vick about
life intestate leaving an Estate in lands
which by the laws of the commonwealth
of Virginia decends to your orators and
oratrixes in parcenary; that is one
third part thereof to Jacob Vick; one
other third part to Mourning Jordan
Wife to Benja Jordan formerly Mourning
Vick; & the other one third to Essex
Vick Lem. Vick Caty Hargrave late
Caty Vick & Patience Vick children &
heirs of Lydia Vick who was wife of
Philip Vick and sister to Jesse Vick
the said intestate. That the s.
tract of land containing two hundred
and forty acres your orators & oratrixes
conceive to be of the value of four or
five hundred Dollars now in the hands
of Benja Jordan; or by him rented
out, as the Executor of Christian Vick
dec'd who was the widow of Jesse
dec'd and by the said executor withheld

From your orators and oratrices - who
pray this court will decree a division
of the said land in manner as the law
in such cases directs it shall be done -
giving to the said Jacob Vick one
third part to Mournig Jordan one
third part; and the other one third part
to the right heirs of Lucia Vick late
wife of Pilgrim Vick. - And your
orators & oratrices further pray that the
said Benjⁿ Jordan may be made def.
to this bill, and that he may answer

Vick did depart this life intestate,
leaving land as stated in the bill -
that it is also by him rented out
for the present year; and that he

other claim therein than the interest
he holds in right of his said wife
Mournig Jordan. - That the
land may as far as he knows be
worth four or five hundred Dollars
as stated in the bill - and further

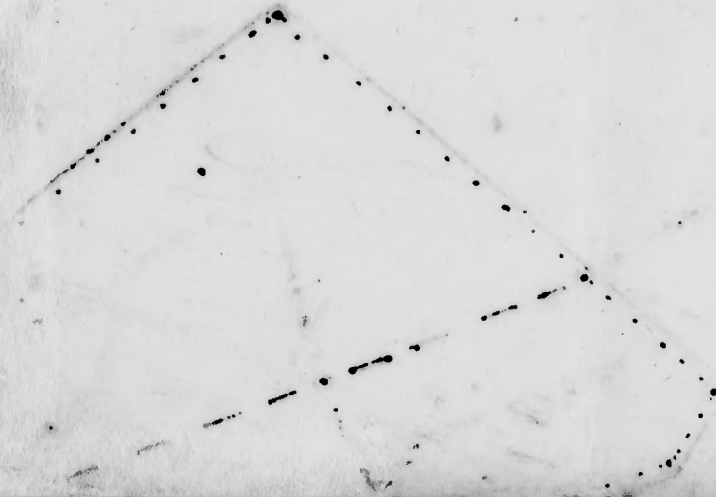

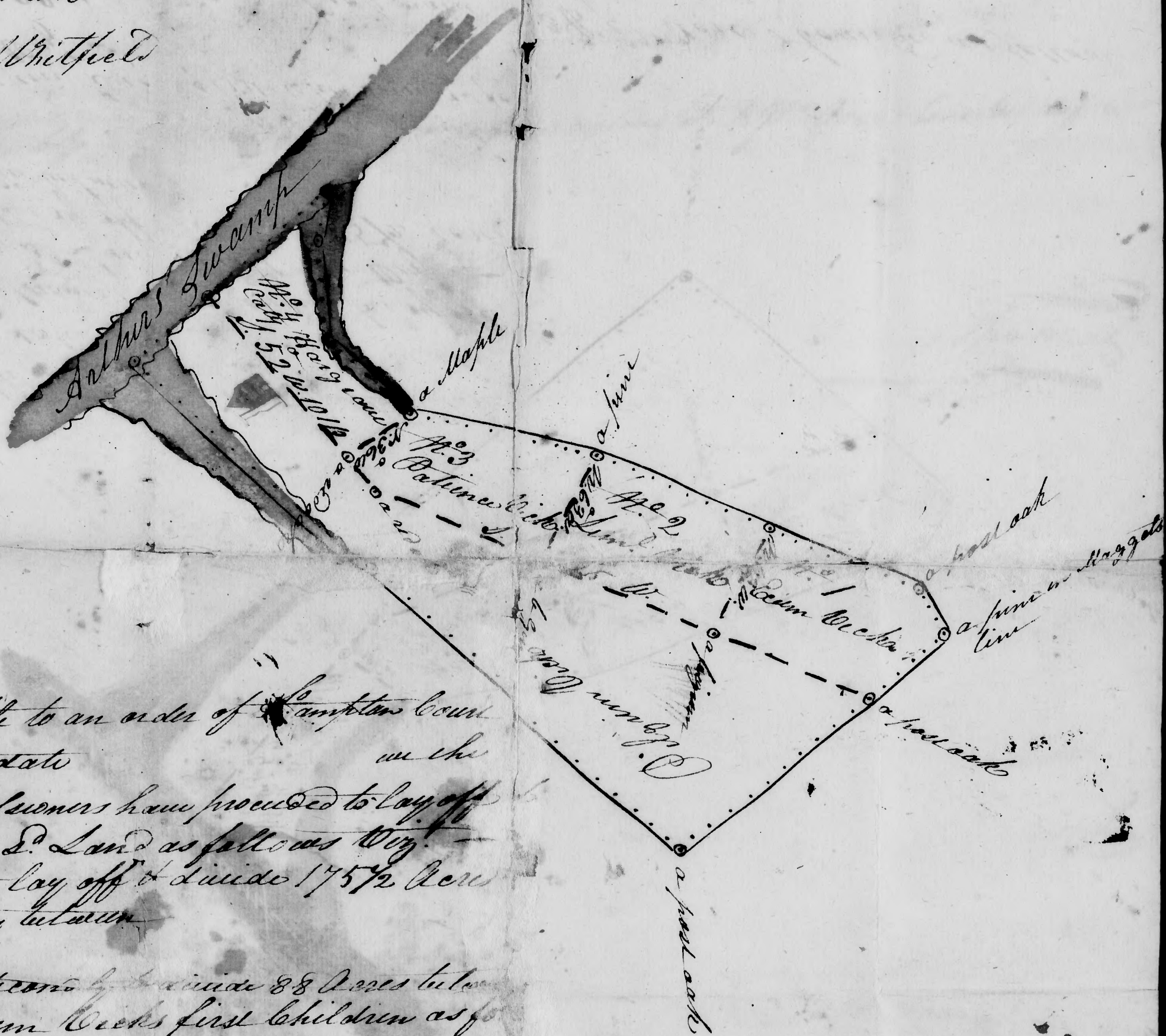
