Humbly complaining your Orator
C. W. Nicholson, sheweth unto your Honor that some
time in 1883 Julia Jones of Southampton
County departed this life intestate leaving
considerable estate both real and personal
and the following persons his distributees
and heirs at law to wit a daughter Anna
Jones married to William Ridley, Robert
Jones, Mary, Margaret Jones a daughter,
and Lila Jones an infant daughter, and
that at the September term 1883 of the
county Court of Southampton William Ridley
qualified as his administrator giving a
bond and security in the sum of \$3000
all of which will more fully appear by a
certificate of his qualification and copy of the
bond herewith filed marked A and prayed to be
taken as a part of this bill

Your Orator further sheweth unto
your Honor that Julia Jones in his lifetime
was indebted to your Orator in the sum
of some nine hundred dollars the
amount not exactly recollecting now and
also indebted to him in this amount
and he herewith files one bond of
\$5000 due him from the said Julia Jones
as a part of this indebtedness marked
exhibit B and prayed to be taken as a
part of this bill. Your Orator sheweth

* Julia Jones for himself, and all other creditors of
George Jones and Julia Jones come in and bear their
share of the costs of this suit

further that the said Juba Jones left
some little household effects and a
growing crop and a tract of land
containing 170 acres lying in Louthampton
and that unimproved with a deed of
trust and he does not think his estate
will make more than pay his debts
and he is compelled to resort to a court
of equity to enforce his debts

For tender consideration whereof
and inasmuch as your Orator is without
relief at law and only entitled to relief in
a court of equity where such matters are
peculiarly cognizable he therefore prays that
William Ridley both in his own right and

by some fit and proper person her guardian
ad litem appointed for that purpose may
be made parties defendant to this bill

would order a commission of this
