This cause came on this day to be heard by consent of parties <sup>being submitted by consent of parties</sup> by consent of parties on the bill, exhibits, answers of the defendants Bowers defendants files on the cause and was argued by counsel. Upon consideration whereof the Court doth acquiesce, order and decree that the defendants Law Bowers Sheriff of the County of Southampton and Committee of the estates of Benjamin Turner and Sonell Turner, render an account of the transactions of the said deceased administrators of Edmund Turner deceased, and also an account of the own transactions as Committee upon the estates of the said Benjamin and Sonell Turner before Commencement of the Court, who is directed to examine Make and settle the same, and report the same to the Court with any matters specially stated second pertinent by himself or required by the parties to be so stated.

On the motion of James Myrick who hath filed the bill and made oath that according to Law, an injunction is awarded him to stay until the further order of the Court all proceedings in a judgment obtained on the common law side of the Court on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of October 1832 by Colletts Drake for John J. Drake against the said James Myrick. But the effect of the injunction is to be postponed until the said James Myrick shall enter into bond with sufficient security on the behalf of the Court is a separate order to settle the amount recovered by the said judgment with such condition as the Court requires and until he shall also file with the Clerk of the Court a release of all errors at Law within the said judgment and proceedings.

This cause came on this day to be finally heard on the Original and amended bill, answers thereto exhibits examinations of witnesses and the report of Commissioner's Court made in obedience to the order pronounced in this cause on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of December 1831 into the exceptions thereto and was argued by counsel. On consideration whereof it seems to the Court that the said account is only erroneous in charging the said administratrix with the two items of one and a half m<sup>ts</sup> of calculating interest properly, but as the proper amount is not stated in said account stated and marked A and B, wherefore it is directed that the said errors be corrected which being done by consent the Court doth acquiesce, order and decree that the account as thus reformed filed herewith marked C be confirmed and that the defendants out of the estate of the said David Myrick deceased in thousands, pay to the plaintiffs the sum of five hundred and five dollars and twenty one cents with interest thereon at the rate of Six per Centum per Annum from the thirty first day of January 1828 till paid and their costs by them on their part in the behalf expended. Ordered that the Court be signified the first day of the next Term.
