

decreed that on the execution of proper responding bonds the said Rockelle as administrator of the said Thomas do out of assets in his hands pay to Nancy Spencer as administratrix of the deceased Eliza Spencer, the sum of four hundred and fifty five dollars fifty seven cents with interest thereon from the 31st day of December 1829 her one third of the balance due from the said Thomas as administrator of the said Spencer, also the sum of four hundred fifty six dollars fifty seven cents with like interest being her moiety of Richard Carter Spencer's distribution share - but she does not to her credit for the amount admitted against the said Nancy Spencer of Two hundred and thirteen dollars and ninety two cents as on the 31st December 1830 was the balance thereof credited by the said Rockelle on account executed by the said Nancy our Under Sheriff as her surety, to the said Thomas as administrator of the said Spencer &c. - That the said Rockelle administrator &c. as aforesaid, do pay to the plaintiff David Barrett the further sum of Two hundred and twenty eight dollars twenty three and a half cents with interest thereon from the 31st day of December 1829 and the like sum and like interest to Benjamin Carter Spencer - that the costs be paid by the respective parties - My commission of Charles Richard Warden is permitted to have the benefit of the decree, he accounting with the plaintiffs respectively for the proportion due them, on connection with payments heretofore made by him to them on that account.
