The defendants in this cause against the defendant Dorothy N. Deane having been excluded more than four months, and she still refusing to appear and file her answer to the bill as to that defendant is taken for confessed, and the cause comes on for trial on the bill, answer and original bills the answer of the defendant ~~Thomas Deane~~ with an exception thereto, the answer of the defendant Eleonore Rockelle to which an exception has been filed, together with the exhibits referred to and now argued by counsel. On consideration thereof the Court with the leave of justice that the property rendered in the schedule as appears in the proceedings mentioned at ~~Windsor~~ for the plaintiff's demand, as the judges, order and decree that Edward Wells late deputy of Eleonore Rockelle late high Sheriff of the County of Southampton, do sell at public auction after giving ten days notice of the time and place of sale, and convey to the purchaser or purchasers all that interest right and title of the defendant Thomas Deane and Dorothy N. his wife, in and to the property both real and personal, contained in the schedule in the proceedings mentioned, or so much thereof as may be necessary, and out of the proceeds arising from the said sales pay to the plaintiff the sum of two hundred and twenty one dollars twenty eight cents with interest from the 16th day of May 1834, also five dollars and fifty four cents, together with the cost of this suit and report his proceedings herein in order to a final decree —

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the first day of the next Term —
