This cause in which the plaintiff appears to have been duly executed on the defendant Martha Gardner and the bill filed more than four months, and the Bill failing to appear and answer the Court doth take the complainants bill for confidit at their baronial on this day to be heard on the Bill answer of the defendant James Blits administrator of George Gardner esq; and of the infant defendants by Littleton R. Edwards their guardian appeared, the complainants third, defendant demands payment of interest and costs as the proceeding referred to and was argued by counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge and decree that the Complainants of this Court, proceed to take the following account. First an account of the debts and savings of the defendant James Blits on the estate of his testator George Gardner deceased. Secondly an account pertaining to the plaintiff's demand. Thirdly an account of the real estate to which the said George Gardner died entitled showing the annual value, simple value thereof and with whose hands the same passed by descent or devise and if altered, by whom, when and at what price. In taking of which first account, the defendant is directed to ascertain and state what bills paid by the administrator Blits bound the heirs of the said testator -

And liberty is reserved to all other creditors of the said George Gardner esq; on the named bond, to exhibit and prove before the Complainants their respective claims against the estate of the said George Gardner - which said several accounts the said Complainant is directed to examine into and settle and to the Court report, with any other(s) specially stated demand furtherment by himself, or which may be required by the parties to be so stated -
