Intaking which said ~~opposed~~ accounts, the Commissioners is directed to ascertain and state what debts paid by the administrator, Wick bound the heirs of the said intestate.

And liberty is remitted to all other creditors of the said George Gardner dec^d on the same terms to exhibit and prove before the Commissioners their respective claims against the estate of the said George Gardner, which said several accounts the said Commissioners is directed to examine state and settle and to the Court report, with any matters specially stated demanded or proven by themselves, or which may be required by the parties to be so stated.
