

Shall failing to appear and file his answer. On motion of the plaintiff by Counsel, the Court doth take their bill for confessed. And on the further motion of the plaintiff by their Counsel, the Court will order that John M. Gurley, Davis Bennett and Thomas Willcox . . . or any two of them, being first duly sworn do fairly value the tract of land containing about One hundred and twenty five acres more or less, which the said defendant derived by descent from his father John Rockelle, and which was set apart and allotted to him by Commissioners acting under the authority of a decree of the County Court of Southampton, and of which the defendant was possessed when he left this Commonwealth; and that the said Commissioners do also enquire whether the said defendant hath any personal estate, or funds, within the power of the Court out of which the debt due to the plaintiff, or any part thereof can be discharged; and that they report their proceedings to this Court with a view to a further decree.

It appearing to the Court by the Sheriff's return on the writs of fieri facias that so much of the decree pronounced in this cause at the last Court in favor of the plaintiff Knofflet Dwy and the Defendant Charles Dwy as directed the defendant George Dwy administrator with the will annexed of Thomas Dwy deceased out of his own property to pay to the said Knofflet and Charles the sum mentioned, has been executed, Confirmation of the said plaintiff, and of the said Charles Dwy by Counsel, in pursuance of leave reserved. It is adjudged, ordered and decreed that the defendant Bailey Breyant and Charlotte his wife as administrators and Administratrix of the will annexed of Howell Nicholas deceased out of the estate of the said Howell Nicholas deceased in their hands for administration, and the defendant John Williams, do pay to the plaintiff Knofflet Dwy the sum of Eight hundred and fifty nine dollars and eighty ~~three~~ cents with interest thereon from the 25th day of December 1822 till paid and one half of this sum in this sum, and that the said defendants in like manner pay to the defendant Charles Dwy the sum of a like hundred and forty seven dollars and eighty seven cents with interest at the rate of six per cent per annum from the 7th day of September 1821 till paid.
