This cause came on this day to be further heard on the papers formerly read and the
report of the Commissioner to which no exception was filed, and was signed by Counsel -
On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree, that the defendants,
Harry Applewhite, Thomas Redden and Alexander P. Peete do pay to the plaintiff the sum
of sixteen dollars and twenty four cents without interest due on the 31st day of December
in the year 1828 till paid; and that the defendants Alexander P. Peete, Benjamin
Lewis and George A. W. Stevens as the administrators of Harvey Stevens deceased, out
of the assets in their hands to be administered do pay to the plaintiff the sum of four hundred
and ninety two dollars and fifty nine cents with interest on four hundred and twelve dollars
and thirty seven cents from the 31st day of December in the year 1828 till paid; and that
the costs sustained by the plaintiff in this suit be paid in equal proportion by the defendants
Harry Applewhite, Thomas Redden and Alexander P. Peete on the one part, and the Defendants
and Alexander P. Peete, Benjamin Lewis and George A. W. Stevens as the administrator of
Harvey Stevens deceased, out of the assets in his hands to be administered, on the other part -

take an account of the payments made by William Coffin to Allen Edwards or to Joseph
Jeyes on account of the Negligent goods by the said William Coffin to the said
Jeyes together with Allen Edwards his attorney as also to all other private or individual
accounts remaining open between the said complainant and the said defendant Allen
Edwards, and that the Commissioner make effort with my remarks several pertinent by him-
self or which may be required by the parties to be stated.

Ordered that the same be adjourned till to morrow morning 10. O'Clock.
