Sd^{ts}. County Court of

Southampton made on the 16th day of June 1805 whereby an injunction
awarded on the 15th day of May 1815 enforcing all further proceedings upon
a judgment obtained in the said County Court by Samuel Blunt adminis-
trator of Robert Bird dec^d. for the benefit of George Parley was dissolved
and the plaintiffs bill dismissed with costs.

This day came the parties by their Council, and for reasons appearing to the Court it is
ordered that the order made in this cause on yesterday be set aside. And thereupon the cause
coming on again to be heard upon the transcript of the record of the order aforesaid, was
argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof it seems to the Court here that the order of the
County Court aforesaid is erroneous. Therefore it is decreed and ordered that the same
be reversed and annulled, and that the defendants out of the estate of said Robert Bird and inter-
ests in their hands to be administered pay to the plaintiff his estate by him expounded in
the proceedings of his writ aforesaid there and that the cause be sent back to the County
Court with directions to re-doCKET it and send it to the Sd^{ts}. for further proceedings -

This day came the parties by their Council and the plaintiffs filed their bill, to which the
defendants filed his answer and the plaintiffs replied generally thereto, and thereupon the
cause coming on to be heard by consent of parties on the bill, answer, replication thereto and
exhibits filed, was argued by Counsel. On mature consideration whereof the Court doth
order and decree that the said Sack Barnes executor of George Whitfield deceased
pay to the plaintiff Jonathan T. Griffin for the life of his wife Polly late Whitfield the
sum of One hundred and thirty five dollars fifty six cents with legal interest on One
hundred and twenty six dollars and four cents paid thereof from the third day of
January 1801 till paid reported due on the account current in the papers filed, upon
the said Griffin executing a releasing bond, conditioned according to law
and on his executing bonds with security conditioned for the return of the said sum of
money upon the termination of the life estate of Mrs. Griffin deceased her by George
Whitfield her former husband, and should the plaintiff Jonathan T. Griffin not accept
the payment upon the conditions aforesaid the executor is then to put the money aforesaid
out at least in good security and pay the interest annually to the plaintiff, and that
the costs of this suit be paid by the parties respectively -

The defendant in this cause having been executed and the bill filed more than six months, and the defendant
refusing to appear and answer the said bill is taken for confessed and the cause coming on to be heard upon the
bill and the affidavit of due diligence
