Title County Court of
Southampton made on the 18th day of June 1835 whereby an injunction
awarded on the 15th day of May 1835 informing all further proceedings upon
a judgment obtained in the said County Court by Samuel Blunt attorney
of Robert Goddard dec'd for the benefit of George Quayle was dissolved
and the plaintiff's bill dismissed with costs -

Writ
This day came the parties by their counsel, and for reasons appearing to the Court it is
ordered that the order made in this cause on yesterday be set aside. And therefore the cause
coming on again to be heard upon the transcript of the record of the order aforesaid, was
argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof it seems to the Court here that the order of the
County Court aforesaid is erroneous. Therefore it is deemed and ordered that the same
be reversed and annulled, and that the defendants out of the estate of their testator and inter-
ested in their hands to be administered pay to the plaintiff his costs by him expended in
the prosecution of his writ aforesaid here and that the cause be sent back to the County
Court with directions to no longer sit and send it to the Rules for further proceedings -

This day, came the parties by their Counsel and the plaintiff filed his bill, to which the
defendant filed his answer and the plaintiff replied generally thereto, and thereupon the
cause coming on to be heard by consent of parties on the bill, answer, replication thereto and
exhibit filed, was argued by Counsel. On mature consideration whereof the Court doth
adjudge order and decree that the said Sack Barnes executor of George Whitfield deceased
pay to the plaintiff Jonathan I. Griffins for the life of his wife Polly late Whitfield the sum of One hundred and thirty five dollars fifty six cents with legal interest on One
hundred and twenty six dollars and four cents part thereof from the third day of
January 1835 till paid reported due on the account current in the papers filed, upon
the said Griffins executing a refunding bond conditioned according to law,
and on his executing bond with security conditioned for the return of the said sum of
money upon the termination of the life estate of Mrs. Griffins devised her by George
Whitfield her former husband; and should the plaintiff Jonathan I. Griffins not accept
the payment upon the conditions aforesaid the executor is then to put the money aforesaid
out at loan on good security and pay the interest annually to the plaintiff; and that
the costs of this suit be apportioned by the parties respectively -
