The defendant Hardy Harris Curator of the estate of Giles Reese deceased who is not
of this County, and against whom the plaintiff appears to have proceeded in the mode
indicated by law against absent defendants, still feeling to appear and answer, on
motion of the plaintiff by Counsel, his bill is taken for confessed, and the cause coming
on to be heard on the bill, answer of the defendant Brown, replication thereto and exhibits
submitted, was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court didly adjudged
order and decree that the injunction awarded the plaintiff on the 3rd day of April
one thousand eight hundred and thirty five to injure the defendant from further proceed-
ings on a judgment recovered by the defendant Harris Curator of the estate of Giles Reese
deceased for the benefit of the defendant Orms & Brown against the plaintiff in the com-
mon law side of this Court, on the 2nd day of April 1835, for the sum of three hundred
and fifty seven dollars sixty eight cents and costs, to be discharged by the payment of
one hundred and seventy eight dollars and eighty four cents with legal interest
thereon from the 3rd day of February 1831 till paid, and the costs, be dissolved, that
the bill of the plaintiff be dismissed and that he pay to the defendant their costs by
them about their defence in this behalf expended.
