This cause (in which the defendant appears to have been tried in the defendant) Mary  
Ferguson and four months having elapsed since the filing of the bill and service of the subpoena  
and the defendant failing to appear, the bill is taken for confessed ad hoc, come in this day to be  
heard on the bill of complaint, answer of the several defendants and respective heirs,  
together with the answer of Margaret Wilson administrator of John Ferguson deceased filed  
on yesterday or condition that no delay of the trial of this case should take place, and application  
therefor, and the exhibits filed, and was argued by counsel; On consideration whereof  
the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that the Commissioners of the Court do take the  
following accounts: 1. An account of the transaction of the defendant Margaret Wilson as  
administrator of the estate of her husband John Ferguson deceased, particularly specifying  
howe the amount of debt existing at the time; 2. an account of the debt due to the plaintiffs and  
3. an account of the real estate of which John Ferguson died seized and possessed, and which  
descended to his heirs, showing the absolute and annual value thereof, and liberty is given  
to all other creditors of the said John Ferguson to submit and prove their respective demands  
before the Commissioners whose account the Commissioner is directed to examine state and  
tell and to the Court report with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by himself  
which may be required by the parties to be so stated.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till to morrow morning Four O'clock
