Mason is the Commissioner of this Court after having given notice of the time and place of sale for a reasonable time in some newspaper in the Town of Petersburg and in the neighborhood of the premises to sell the tract of land in the proceedings mentioned, requiring one third of the purchase money in cash and giving credit for the other two thirds over and two years in equal annual instalments, and that the said Commissioner take of the purchase bond and good security for the purchase money as above indicated reserving the title until the payment of the purchase money, and that having made sale on the terms aforesaid that he report his proceedings in the premises together with the said bonds to this Court preparatory to a final decree.
