This cause came on this day to be again heard in the papers formerly read and the  
 report of Commissioners Recd. together with the special statement marked A, made  
 in pursuance to the order of the 19<sup>th</sup> December 1838, to which no exception has been filed  
 and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof, the court confirming the said  
 report and statement, will adjudge, decree and order that the said Mr. Butcher, after  
 having given notice of the time and place of sale for at least thirty days by adver-  
 tisement posted at the door of the Courthouse of this County and at some publick  
 places nearest to the premises and also by advertisement to be inserted in one of the  
 newspapers published in the Town of Petersburg, sell to the highest bidder upon a credit  
 of nine months (except for so much as will be required to defray the expenses of  
 this suit and of the sale, which will be in cash) the lands in the County of Southampton  
 whereof Nathaniel Rockelle died seized as an estate of inheritance taking of the  
 purchaser bonds with approved security in such way as to enable him to comply  
 with the terms of this decree and also having a deed of trust to secure the payment of  
 the purchase money. That he first pay to John G. Mason One hundred and thirty  
 one dollars and thirty five cents with interest on One hundred and twenty two dollars  
 and eleven cents part thereof from the 15<sup>th</sup> day of June 1835 till paid, and that  
 of the balances of the proceeds of the sale are found sufficient, the Commissioner  
 will pay to John G. Mason the sum of three hundred and thirty five dollars and  
 fifty one cents with interest thereon from the 15<sup>th</sup> day of June 1838 till paid.  
 To Henry Hundred twenty eight dollars twenty nine cents with interest on Twenty  
 seven dollars twelve cents part thereof from the 20<sup>th</sup> of October 1838 till paid, and  
 to William D. Phillips Two hundred and fifty seven dollars thirty six cents with  
 interest from the 15<sup>th</sup> of May 1835 till paid - but if it be found that the sum is  
 insufficient to pay the whole of the three last demands, then the Commissioner shall  
 pay them from his fee. It is further ordered that the Commissioner bring the bonds  
 for the balance, if any, into Court subject to the further order of this court - The Com-  
 missioner will make a deed to the purchaser without warranty and pay out of the sale  
 the costs of this suit -
