This cause came on again to be heard on the papers formerly read together with the report of the
 Commissioner made pursuant to the decretal order of the 15th of December 1838 under which
 report no exceptions have been filed and was argued by counsel on consideration whereof the Court
 confirming said reports doth adjudge, order and decree that unless the Defendants the heirs of
 Edward Pitney or some person on their behalf within sixty days from the coming of this Court doth
 shall pay to the plaintiff the sum of \$62.45 with interest on \$57.63 part thereof from April 7th
 1836 and on \$4. another part thereof from this date till paid. To Henry Pitney the sum of
 \$12.20 with interest thereon from September 9th 1837 till paid. and to Dorothy Williams the sum
 of \$15.82 with interest on \$14.37 from 16th February 1828 till paid and the costs of this suit
 that Edward Butler who is hereby appointed a Commissioner for this purpose after giving thirty
 days notice of the time and place of sale by advertisement posted at the front door of the Court
 house of this County and also at some public place near the land in the proceedings mentioned
 list at public auction the said lands subject to the claims of the widow of Edward Pitney or so
 much as may be necessary to satisfy the sums above mentioned respectively due to the plaintiff
 to Henry Pitney and Dorothy Williams and interest thereon as aforesaid the cost of this suit &
 the expenses of sale upon the following terms: the purchaser to pay in cash the expenses of the
 sale and to execute his bond with good security for the residue payable to the said bond
 commissioners six months after date, and the said Commissioner is bound to make report of
 the proceedings to this Court in order that a final decree may be had herein.

Ordered that this Court be adjourned till Monday morning next Nov, 1838.
