This day this cause came on to be heard on the original and amended bill of the
 defendant Jamuel Backwood Com^r Robert Fort to the said original bill was of Henry
 Miller in his own right and as administrator of Robert Fort dec^d exhibits first assign-
 ment of Backwood in consideration whereof the Court doth enquire what and does that
 Henry Miller hath before the Commissioners of this Court had administered in Robert
 Fort estate that Jamuel Backwood do render before the same Commissioners an account
 of his transactions as Commissioner of Robert Fort. That Bay^r Griffie Plff^r account of
 Joseph Fort dec^d render an account before the same Commissioners of his adminis-
 tration on Joseph Fort's estate. And that the same Commissioners make up and report
 a bill of the accounts showing the amount respectively paid to and received by the
 widow and only child of the said Robert Fort which said several accounts the
 said Commissioners is directed to examine state and settle and to the best report
 with any matter specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or required by the
 parties to be so stated.

Maria Parker and Annand Sutton the latter being an infant of tender
 years by the said Maria Parker her sister and next friend Plff.

The defendants H. J. Smith, Harrison Robt. Matthew W. Vaughan and Benjamin Griffie
 Com^r of Ch. Sutton on which the app^r appears to have been executed for more than ten
 months still failing to appear on the motion of the plffs the bill is taken for confes-
 as to them. And the cause came on to be heard on the bill exhibits and examination
 of witnesses and was argued by Counsel in consideration whereof the Court doth enquire
 what and does that Hannum J. Smith, Harrison Robt. and Matthew W. Vaughan
 Executors of Harrison Parker dec^d deliver to Benjamin Griffie administrator of
 Cherry Sutton dec^d the share by the name of Oliver in the bill mentioned that the
 said Executors state before a Commissioner of this Court an account of the transactions
 of their testator Parker in this estate of Cherry Sutton; that unless they admit afore-
 sufficient to pay whatever may be found due upon the settlement of said accounts
 then they are required to render before the same Commissioners an account of their
 transactions as executors of Harrison Parker dec^d. The Court doth further order and
 decree that Benjamin Griffie Plff^r and administrator de bonis moris of Cherry
 Sutton dec^d render before the same Commissioners an account of his trans-
 actions as administrator of said Sutton and that the Commissioners report the
 said accounts with any matter specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or
 which either of the parties may require to be so specially stated.
