This cause came on this day again to be heard upon the papers formerly read and upon the report of the Commissioner under an interlocutory decree of the 31st of October 1840 to which no exceptions have been filed. and was argued by counsel on consideration whereof the Court considering said report both now argued and decreed that the defendants Hanning J Smith Harrison both and Matthew H Vaughan executors of Harrison Parker dec^d pay to Hanning J Smith administrator of Maria Parker dec^d the sum of Three Hundred and Seven dollars and Seventy three and a half Cents with legal interest on two hundred and sixty three dollars and seventy two Cents paid thereof from the 31st of December 1840 till paid and that the said Executor pay to the legal guardian of Amasa Butlers the unpaid Complaint the like sum with like interest. And it being suggested that an error was committed in the decree of the 31st of October 1840 directing the said executor to deliver out to Benjamin Griffen administrator of Sherry Butler dec^d a slave by the name of Eliza whom in truth the said slave was named Betty it is now ordered adjudged and decreed that the said Executor deliver up to the said Griffen administrator the said slave Betty and that the said Executor out of the sale of their estate Harrison Parker in their hands to be administered pay the cost of this suit. And leave is reserved to the plaintiffs to apply for any further order and decree in the premises, if needful
