The defendant Josiah Cobb who is out of the country and against whom the plaintiff appears
to have proceeded in the mode permitted by law against absent defendants and he failing to ap-
pear and file his answer, and as to the other defendants on whom the subpoena appears to have
been executed more than two months and they still failing to answer, and the motion of the plain-
tiff by his Counsel the bill as to these defendants is taken for confessed. And the cause came on to be
heard on the bill and exhibits and argument of Counsel, on consideration whereof the Court doth
adjudge, order and decree that the defendant Josiah Cobb do pay to the plaintiff the sum of fifty
dollars with legal interest thereon from the 9th day of March 1839 till paid and the costs of this
suit. And unless the said defendant shall pay the same on or before the day of sale hereafter
mentioned that Anthony Vaughan, Matthew W. Vaughan and Thomas Lawrence who are hereby
appointed commissioners for that purpose, any two of whom may act, do after having published
notice of the time and place of sale by advertising the same at the same at the Court of the Court house
of this County, on some Court day, and at one or more public places in the said County at least thirty
days before the day of sale, proceed to sell at public auction to the highest bidder for cash the interest
said, one third, which Josiah Cobb has in and to the lower place, that is to say, New, Colander and
Junc now held by Patsy Cobb widow of Josiah Cobb, dec.; and out of the proceeds of said sale
after paying the expenses and costs of this suit and sale pay to the plaintiff his debt and interest
advanced, and the balance to return to Court. and make report of their proceedings to the
Court.
