The defendant Joseph Cobb who is out of this country and against whom the plaintiff appears
to have proceeded in the mode prescribed by law against absent defendants and he failing to ap-
pear and file his answer; and as to the other defendants on whom the subpoena appears to have
been executed more than two months and they still failing to answer, and the motion of the plain-
tiff by his counsel the bill as to those defendants is taken for confessed. And the cause came on to be
heard on the bill and exhibits and argument of counsel, in consideration whereof the court doth
adjudge, order and direct that the defendant Joseph Cobb do pay to the plaintiff the sum of fifty
dollars with legal interest thereon from the 4th day of March 1839 till paid and the costs of this
suit. And unless the said defendant shall pay the same on or before the day of sale hereafter
mentioned the Anthony Vaughan, Matthew H. Vaughan and Thomas Lawrence who are hereby
appointed Commissioners for that purpose, any two of whom may act, do after having published
notice of the time and place of sale by advertising the same at the door of the courthouse
of this County, on some convenient day, and at one or more public places in the said County at least thirty
days before the day of sale, proceed to sell at public auction to the highest bidder for each the interest
first, next, third, which Joseph Cobb has in and to the slaves, that is to say, Dom, Elender and
Jewel now held by Patsey Cobb widow of Joseph Cobb, dec'd. and out of the proceeds of said sale
after paying the expenses and costs of the suit and sale pay to the plaintiff his debt and interest
aforesaid, and the remainder return to court. and make report of their proceedings to the
court.
