

Bennett J. Griffin and Susanna his wife late Joyner

against

Allen Edwards administrator of Matthew Joyner dec^d. and as guardian of Susanna Griffin late Joyner and Charles M. Sarah and Matthew Joyner, and the said Charles M. Sarah and Matthew Joyner infants by Edward de Ruttle their guardians appointed to defend them in this suit.

This day this cause came on to be argued heard upon the papers formerly read, and the report of the Commissioner made pursuant to a decree entered hereon on the 30th of October 1840 to which no exception has been filed, and the parties, in view of the execution of the intervening decree in respect to the settlement of the accidental account - and in argument of Bennett.

On consideration whereof the Court confirming the said report doth adjudge, order and decree that the defendants Allen Edwards administrator of Matthew Joyner dec^d. do pay over to the plaintiffs Bennett J. Griffin and wife the sum of five hundred and forty five dollars forty one cents with interest on five hundred and twenty five dollars twenty five cents past thereof from the 31st of December 1840. and the Court doth further adjudge, order and decree that Thomas J. Borden, James Clayton and Thomas White who are hereby appointed Commissioners for the purpose, any two of whom may act, proceed to assign one fourth part in kind of the Slave, to wit, Sam. Henderson, Abramson, Bartholomew and Hannah held by the said Allen Edwards guardian of the infants of Matthew Joyner dec^d to the plaintiffs Bennett J. Griffin and wife; and the other three parts remain to the guardian to be held by him for the benefit of Charles M. Sarah and Matthew Joyner and make report of their proceedings to the Court. And leave is hereby given the plaintiffs to amend their bill. And leave is reserved the plaintiffs to apply to the Court hereafter if needed for further relief.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till tomorrow morning nine o'clock.
