This day this cause came on to be legally heard upon the premises formerly recd, and the report of the Commissioner made pursuant to a decree entered herein on the 30th of October 1840 to which no exception has been filed, and the parties, agreeing the execution of the intention done in respect to the settlement of the account aforesaid, and an argument of counsel.

On consideration whereof the Court concurring the said report doth adjudge, order and decree that the defendant Allen Edwards administrator of Matthew Joyner deceased, do pay over to the plaintiff Bennett J Griffin and wife the sum of five hundred and forty five dollars forty one cents with interest on five hundred and forty five dollars twenty five cents part thereof from the 31st of December 1840, and the Court doth further adjudge, order and decree that Thomas J Weston, James Clayton and Henry White who are hereby appointed Commissioners for the purpose, any two of whom may act, proceed to affix one fourth part to each of the said, to wit, Joe Weston, Harrison and Bramhall held by the said Allen Edwards guardian of the infants of Matthew Joyner deceased to the plaintiff Bennett J Griffin and wife; and the other three parts return to the guardian to be held by him for the benefit of Charles M. Sarah and Matthew Joyner and make report of their proceedings to the Court. And leave is hereby given the plaintiff to amend this bill. And liberty is reserved the plaintiff to apply to the Court hereafter if needful for further relief.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till to morrow morning nine o'clock.
