This defendant Simon Butler who is out of this County and against whom the plaintiff appears to have proceeded in the mode prescribed by Law against absent defendants still failing to appear and answer in motions of the plaintiff by Counsel the Court with Take his bill for Conspect as to him. And the Cause coming on to be heard as to the other defendant and the bill his answer and the exhibit filed in the Cause was argued by Counsel on consideration whereof the Court with adjudge order and decree that the defendant Simon Butler pay to the plaintiff the sum of forty five dollars and Interest from the 25th of December 1819 till paid together with his Costs. And that the defendant Harrison & others render up to E. Bates who is hereby appointed a Commissioner for that purpose the property in his answer admitted to be in his houses of the defendant Simon Butler. And the said Commissioner is hereby directed after having given Ten days notice of the time and place of sale to sell the same for Cash and pay out of the proceeds of such sale the Cost by the said defendant Harrison & others expended in defending this suit. And pay to the plaintiff in satisfaction of his debt the amount above decreed to be on him with his Costs. And the said Commissioner is further directed to report his proceedings to the Court. But the plaintiff is not to have the benefit of this decree until he shall have entered into bond with sufficient security in the Clerk's office of this Court in a sum equal to the said of One hundred dollars with such conditions as the Law requires in case of absent defendants—
