The defendant Simon Battin who is out of this County and against whom the plaintiff appears to have proceeded in the cause presented by Law against whom defendant still failing to appear and answer the motions of the plaintiff by Counsel the Court will take his bill for Confused as to him. And the cause coming on to be heard as to the other defendant and the bill his answer and the exhibit filed in the cause was argued by Counsel on consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge rule and decree that the defendant Simon Battin pay to the plaintiff the sum of forty five dollars with Interest from the 25th of December 1839 till paid together with his costs. And that the defendant Harrison D. Moore render up to E. Butts who is hereby appointed a Commissioner for that purpose the property in his answer admitted to be in his hands of the defendant Simon Battin. And the said Commissioner is hereby directed after having given ten days notice of the time and place of sale to sell the same for cash and pay out of the proceeds of such sale the costs by the said defendant Harrison D. Moore expended in defending this suit and pay to the plaintiff in satisfaction of his debt the amount above directed to be due him and costs. And the said Commissioner is further directed to report his proceedings to this Court. But the plaintiff is not to have the benefit of this decree until he shall have interest into hand with sufficient security in the Registry office of this Court in as promptly equal to the sum of One hundred dollars with such conditions as the Law requires in case of absent defendant.
