This cause came on again to be heard on the papers formerly read and the report of the
Commissioner made pursuant to the order of the 8th of April 1848, to which no exception has been filed,
and was argued by Counsel, on consideration whereof, the Court doth adjudge, order and decree
that the said report be confirmed, and that the defendant Mary W Kello pay to the plaintiff
Thomas W Vaughan and his wife Margaret, the sum of Eighty three dollars thirty and a
half cents with interest thereon from the 31st day of December 1840 till paid, and the
further sum of ninety dollars nine and one third cents with interest thereon from the 31st day
of December 1841 till paid; and that she also pay to Samuel J Douglas and his wife Louisa
H D the sum of Eighty three dollars thirty and a half cents with interest thereon from the
31st day of December 1840 till paid, and Ninety dollars nine and one third cents with interest
thereon from the 31st day of December 1841 till paid; and that the said Thomas W Vaughan
and Samuel J Douglas or some person for them shall each receive a bond with good
security, in the penalty of five hundred dollars payable to the said Mary W Kello,
conditioned to pay to her the sum of fifty dollars per annum for her support and
boards during her widowhood. And that Court doth also order that John A Penel
Horrell Farns, Harry Moore & Nathaniel Francis, William Fullerton, Samuel Dowry
and John Drury, or any three of them proceed to divide into shares equal, those slaves
Peter Anderson, Moses Arthur, Gardine, Lucy and Jane, being the slaves belonging
to the estate of William P Kello, and set apart one third to Thomas W Vaughan
and wife, one third to Samuel J Douglas and wife and the other third part to the
defendant Mary W Kello. And that the said Commissioner or any three of them do
also divide equally between Samuel J Douglas and his wife Louisa H D and the
plaintiff Thomas W Vaughan and his wife Margaret P all the lands in the County
of Southampton whereof James Kello died seized as an estate of inheritance and which
was devised by the last will and Testament of said James Kello to his son William P.
Kello, having regard in such division to quality and quantity, and make report to
this Court.
