The subpoenas on the amended bills having been executed more than two months and  
the defendants still failing to appear the same are taken for confessed against the  
said defendants except Nancy Miller who has filed her answer to the said first  
amended bill and the cause coming on to be heard on the original and amended bills  
answer of the defendant Samuel Braekant Committed of Robert Fort to the said original  
bill, and Nancy Miller on her own right and as administratrix of Robert Fort  
dec<sup>d</sup> and exhibits and upon the statement or report of the Commissioner marked  
A, showing the amount of the plaintiffs demand and was argued by Counsel,  
on consideration whereof the plaintiff waiving for the present his right to have  
the decree entered hereon on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of October 1840 carried into effect,  
but reserving to himself the liberty to ask hereafter if deemed needful for the  
settlement of any accounts or accounts which may be necessary for his relief or for  
any other or further decree against the defendant Nancy Miller individually  
or as representative of Robert Fort or against any one or more of the other defendants.  
The Court doth adjudge, order and decree that Nancy Miller out of the assets  
of her estate in her hands to be administered pray over to John M. Gurley admini-  
strator de bonis non of George Gurley the elder dec<sup>d</sup> the sum of One hundred and  
seventy seven dollars, seventy cents with interest thereon from the 15<sup>th</sup> day of  
March 1842 till paid and his costs in this suit and this suit expended.

This day this cause came on to be again heard on the application of the  
plaintiff for a remedy during the pendency of this suit, and she as party affide-  
rite filed with the bill as well also, as the additional separate affidavits filed  
before, and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof, the Court doth  
adjudge, order and decree that the plaintiff recover of the defendant, to be  
paid to Hardy Rault, her next friend the sum of Twenty five dollars quarterly  
until the further order of the Court. Commencing on the first day of November  
1841, and the further sum of twenty five dollars to be paid in like manner  
as a relief from her present wants and necessities.
