This day this cause came on to be heard by consent of parties on the bill and answer of the defendant  
and was argued by Counsel, whereupon the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that  
Howell Harris, William A. Jones and Henry Moore Commissioners authorized to  
sell the slaves Jacob and Jim in the bill mentioned, run in possession of Nathan A. Thomas  
at public auction, after twenty days notice of the time and place of sale; on a trial of twelve  
months, and take there separate, of equal amount with sufficient security, and assign one to  
Nathan A. Thomas, one to John A. Thomas and the other to the complainants Edwin W.  
Cloud as assignee of David A. Thomas, and that said Commissioners make up, audit  
and settle an account of the value of said slaves from the first day of January 1837 and  
make report thereof to this Court in order to a final decree.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till tomorrow morning 10 o'clock.
