This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and it appearing to the Court that the defendants have had legal notice of this motion they were solemnly called but came not. Therefore it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff may have execution against the defendants for the sum of seven hundred and forty six dollars & twenty four cents the penalty of the said bond and costs by him about his motion in this behalf expended. And the said defendants in Mercy &c. But this execution may be discharged by the payment of Four hundred and seventy three dollars & twenty cents with legal interest thereon from the 22nd day of June 1842 till paid and the costs.

This day this cause came on to be heard by consent of parties, on the bill and answer of the defendants and was argued by Counsel, whereupon the Court ^{in presence of parties} after deliberation, order and decree that Howell Ward, William A. Jones and Henry Moore Comptrollers Commissioners authorized to sell the slaves Jacob and Jem in the bill mentioned, under the supervision of Nathan A. Thomas at public auction after twenty days notice of the time and place of sale, on a credit of twelve months, and take three separate bungs of equal amount with sufficient security, and assign one to Nathan A. Thomas, one to John A. Thomas and the other to the Comptrollers. Edwin W. Glauert as assignee of David H. Thomas. and that said Commissioners make up, audit and settle an account of the sales of said slaves from the first day of January 1837 and make report thereof to this Court in order to a final decree.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till to morrow morning 10 o'clock.
