This day this cause came on to be further heard by consent of parties, on the papers heretofore read and on the report of the Commissioners made in pursuance of an order of this Court pronounced at October Term 1842. On consideration whereof the Court doth confirm so much of said report as relates to the sale of the slaves Luck, Robt and Henry and by consent of parties, so much of the order of October Term 1842, referring the account of the sales of said slaves to Howell Harris, William A. Jones and Henry A. Jones as set aside - And the Court doth order, adjudge and decree, that Jeremiah Cobb a Commissioner of this Court and State, and to the Court's report an account of the sales of the slaves Luck, Robt and Henry (which were in the possession of William B. Kloud) from the first day of January 1842 to the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of December 1842, with any matters specially stated, deemed pertinent, by himself or which may be required to be so stated.
