On the petition of John D. Moyler administrator de bonis non with the will
annexed of John J. Barrow, and by consent of parties he made a defed and to
the suit, and hearing this cause this day came on again to be heard on the
paper formerly read and the Report of Joseph O'Cloud a Commissioner appoin-
ted by a Decree of this Court pronounced on 3rd November 1842 to sell the
slaves of the Estate of Philipus J. Barrow deceased, to which report there is
no exception and was argued by Counsel - On consideration whereof the Court
doth confine the said report of Joseph O'Cloud confirmed, and doth order
that the bonds for one eighth of one moiety forfeited by the decree of 3rd No-
vember 1842, to be delivered to R. S. Musgrave administrator of John J. Barrow
deceased be delivered by the Clerk of this Court to John D. Moyler administrator
de bonis non with the will annexed of John J. Barrow deceased, and unto
all other matters this cause is continued.

The defendant Joseph Cobb who is out of this County, and against whom the
plaintiff appears to have proceeded in the mode prescribed by Law against
defendents, and as to the Defendant Patsy Cobb, on whom the sub-
poena appears to have been duly executed, and the said Defendant failing
to appear and file his answer, altho ten months have elapsed as well since
the plaintiff filed their bill as since the service of the subpoena on the said
Defendant Patsy Cobb. On motion of the plaintiff by their counsel, this bill is
taken for confessed. Therefore this cause came on to be heard on the bill
of the Plaintiff and was argued by the Plaintiff formerly On Consideration
whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that James H. Morgan
and Harrison Cobb who are hereby appointed Special Commissioners for that
purpose, to proceed to sell at Public auction on a credit of six months
(except for so much as shall be sufficient to pay and satisfy the costs and
expenses of this suit and of the said sale which shall be paid in Cash)
after giving thirty days previous notice of the time and place of said sale at
one or more public places in this County, and also in some public newspaper
published in the Town of Petersburg, the tract of land in the bill mentioned
belonging to David Cobb deceased at the time of his death, subject however
to the Dower of the defendant Patsy Cobb, thence, and also the slaves
in the said bill mentioned of which the said David Cobb died possessed
