This day the causes came on to be heard together on the papers formerly read and on the
reports of Commissioner Wells and on the exceptions of Nathan Thomas and E. B. Blaud made
and the Court sustaining the exceptions of Blaud, and overruling the exception of Nathan
Thomas confirms the said Report in all other things. On consideration shewing the Court
with advice order and decree, that Edwin B. Blaud pay to John Thomas the sum of two
hundred and eight dollars, with interest thereon from the 31st day of December 1822 till
paid, and that he retain the sum of two hundred and forty four dollars with like interest
as his own portion of the amount of hire of the Slaves in the proceedings mentioned, and
that Nathan Thomas pay to John Thomas the sum of thirty six dollars with interest from
31st December 1822 till paid and that he retain the sum of two hundred and forty four
dollars his portion of the hire of the Slaves - It is further ordered and decreed that Edwin
B. Blaud Nathan Thomas and John Thomas pay equally the costs of these suits.
