This cause came up to be heard on the Bill answer and exhibits filed, and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth by present decree that the judgment granted on the 6th of March 1840, to restrain the payment of an execution from the Circuit Superior Court of Law and Chancery for Southampton County issued on the 11 November 1840 in favour of Godwin Parker an infant against the Plaintiff for the sum of \$946.36 cents to be discharged by the payment of the sum of four hundred and seventy three dollars and 17 cents with legal interest thereon from the 20 June 1820 till paid, to defendant, as to the sum of three hundred dollars and twenty six cents, with interest thereon from the 4th January 1820 till paid, and prostrated as to the balance and the Court doth adjudge that the Plaintiff pray to the Defendant his costs by him in this suit expended.
