The defendants Martha Rockelle in her own right and as executrix of James Rockelle and John W. Rockelle by counsel of the plaintiff by General Lenoir and with the leave of the Court this day filed their answers to the plaintiff's bill, to which answers the plaintiff replied generally, and the Subpoenas awarded on that cause having been executed on the Defendants George Blaw, William A Sparks and Samuel B. Hines and they failing to appear and answer within two months have elapsed as well since the filing of the bill as of the service of the Subpoena upon the said Defendants Blaw, Sparks and Hines on the motion of the plaintiff this bill is taken for confessed as to those defendants. And therefore this cause coming on to be heard upon the bill the answers of the other defendants, explanations thereto and exhibits filed and argued by counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that the defendant Martha Rockelle executrix of James Rockelle deceased do answer before William F. Goodwyn a Commissioner of said Court on additional account of her transactions in the estate of her said testator, in which the accounts filed as an exhibit in the bill and answer marked, B. and A. shall be taken from a free correct by consent of parties, subject to be discharged and satisfied, which account the said Commissioner is hereby directed to state and settle with any matters deemed pertinent by himself or required by the parties. That the said defendant do also render before the said Commissioner an account of the number and names of the slaves belonging to Henry M. Gray at the time of his death and the number and names of those deceased since with the names of those who have died, also an account of any that may have been sold by her testator or herself and the several values thereof when sold, also an account of the times or several values of the slaves since the death of the said Henry M. Gray, which said accounts the said Commissioner is also directed to state and settle with any matters deemed pertinent or required by the parties.
