This day this cause in which the subpoena appears to have been returned on all the defendants, who still failing to appear and answer, although two months have elapsed as well since the service of the subpoena as since the plaintiffs filed their bill on motion of the plaintiffs their bill is taken for confessed against all the defendants, and thereupon the cause came on to be heard on the bill, exhibits and statement marked A. and was argued by Counsel, on consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that William L Everett take Sheriff and administrator of the estate of George Bay dec'd out of the assets of his intestate's pay to Isaac Candell and Elizabeth his wife the sum of forty nine dollars and eighty nine cents with interest thereon from the 10th of July 1841 till paid and the costs of this suit. And if the decree should prove unsatisfying against the estate of the said Bay, then the plaintiffs may resort by proper process to make the amount out of Cary Bay and Thomas Atkins.
