This day this cause in which the subpoena appears to have been executed on
all the defendants, who still failing to appear and answer, although two months
have elapsed as well since the service of the subpoena as since the plaintiffs
filed their bill. On motion of the plaintiffs their bill is taken for confessed against
all the defendants, and thereupon the cause came on to be heard on the bill,
