Not appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that the plaintiff has procured
in the Writs presented by her against above defendants and the defendants
of J H Bond Robert Drury J M Bond John D Hill still failing to appear and answer
the plaintiffs bill is taken for confessed as to those defendants and it appearing
that the subpoena awarded in the cause has been executed on all the
other defendants who still fail to appear and answer although two months have
elapsed as well since the service of the said subpoena as since the plaintiff filed
his original and awarded bill the same are taken for confessed as to those
defendants and thereupon the cause came on the day came on to be heard
at the bar of the Court the papers formerly filed and on the report
of Commissioner Galt made in pursuance of an order of the Court pronounced at
the October Term 1841 and now argued by counsel on Consideration the
Court affirming the said Report is which there is no exception to the said
order and docket that the defendant James H Bond pay to the plaintiff
Allison Morris the sum of five hundred and twenty seven dollars and eighty
four cents with interest, to wit at the rate of ten per centum per annum
from October 3^d 1840 till paid and the costs of this suit, and if the decree
should prove unfavorable against the said Bond then liberty is reserved to the
plaintiff to proceed by proper process to recover the said sum of money from
the defendants Robert Drury J M Bond John D Hill John H Bond and
Patrick H Kellings in either of them.
