

Six dollars and forty five cents with interest thereon from the 31st day of March 1848 till paid
then John R. Chumbley who is appointed a Commissioner for that purpose, after giving four weeks
previous notice of the time and place of sale, by advertisement in some newspaper published
in the town of Petersburg and at the Courthouse door of the County of Southampton on some
Court day and at two or more places in the neighborhood of the land, sell at public
auction on the premises, or a credit of one and ten equal annual instalments (except
cash sufficient to pay the expenses of the suit and the expenses of the sale) all the
lands of which Benjamin Turner died, seized and possessed, and in the proceedings
mentioned, subject to the right of dower of the said Turners widow - that the said
Commissioner take lands and security of the purchased for the purchase money, and
retain the title to the land till the whole purchase money is paid. And report his
proceedings to the Court in order to a final decree.

It being suggested to the Court that since the institution of this suit Mary Jane
Rachelle the infant plaintiff petitioner, has intermarried with Richard Crump, it
is ordered that the same be suggested on the record and that this suit be brought for the
proceeding in the name of the said Richard Crump and the said Mary Jane
his wife. And it appearing to the Court that more than two months have elapsed
since the filing of the plaintiffs bill as the service of the subpoena on
the defendant who still fails to appear: on motion of the plaintiff by counsel
their bill is taken for confessed. And the cause coming on to be heard on the
bill and exhibits filed was argued by counsel. On consideration whereof the
Court doth order that William A. Sparks executor of Clements Rachelle dec'd
do render before Commissioner Cobb an account of the said Rachelle's adminis-
tration on the estate of Adolphus Whitchard dec'd and that the said Commis-
sioner audit, state, settle and report the same to Court with any matters spe-
cifically stated deemed pertinent by himself or which may be required to be so
stated by either of the parties.

It appearing to the Court that more than two months have elapsed since
the filing of the plaintiffs bill and service of the subpoena on the defendants

defendants, and the cause coming on to be heard on the bill, review of the
defendant Nicholson replication thereto on exhibits filed and deposition

missioner Cobb an account of her guardianship of her late Lucy A. E. L.
Hall formerly Scarbrough, and that said Commissioner audit, state
and report said account together with any matters specifically stated
which he may deem pertinent or which may be required to be so stated.
