

is a purchaser from John A. Booth's estate in right of his said Purchase a like sum¹⁵⁰⁰⁰ with like interest by consent of said Booth. That the said Edwards who appears as a purchaser of the slaves to which Henry Booth would be entitled retain by virtue of his said purchase a like sum with like interest by consent of said Booth. That the said Edwards¹⁵⁰⁰⁰ will administer to him now of Peter Booth his² property James Holmes & Hancock his wife, to John D. Warren, to John C. Nichols administrator of Isaac Faison^{de} to Wilkins White administrator of his² wife Diana^{de}. To William S. Everett Sheriff & Committee of Peter P. Warren² to William S. Everett Sheriff & Committee of Elizur H. Branch^{de} each the sum of fifteen hundred and thirty eight dollars eighty three cents with interest on eight hundred and forty seven dollars twenty six cents a part thereof from the 31st day of December 1864 till paid.

And the Court doth further adjudge, order and decree that James B. Urquhart, Robert Murray, Benjamin G. Dixie and C. A. W. Kasson any three of whom may act, who are appointed Commissioners for that purpose divide the negroes slaves and their increase of which Peter Booth died possessed into two moieties and allot one moiety to Peter J. Holmes being the portion to which he is entitled in his now right and distribution of his brother John Holmes, the adumus testator of the said John Holmes hereby consenting and agreeing thereto. That they allot one third of the other half to Nicholas P. Branson administrator of his second wife Priscilla. That the remainder (being one third of the whole) be divided into two parts of equal value - one half to be equally divided between John Booth² and Polly his wife, Elizabeth A. Brown, Gardner & Griffin Committee of Peter Booth, Patrick J. Rollings administrator of Ann Rollings, Robert Eldridge Sheriff of Suffolk County & and Committee of the estate of Martha Morris^{de}. John A. Booth and William Hale a purchaser from Henry Booth by consent of said Henry - And the other half to be equally divided between James Holmes and Hancock his wife, John D. Warren, John C. Nichols administrator of Isaac Faison^{de} Wilkins White administrator of his second wife Diana^{de}, William S. Everett Sheriff and Committee of Peter P. Warren² and the said Everett Committee of the estate of Elizur H. Branch^{de}.

That if the division of the last mentioned this cannot be effected in kind the Commissioners will decide as far as it is practicable and if necessary make sale of one or more of the slaves in that portion of the Commonwealth after giving thirty days notice of the time and place of sale, for cash, for the purpose of effecting such division - which said Commissioners are requested to make report to this Court in order to a final decree. And it is further ordered and directed that William S. Gardner² one of the Commissioners of the Court ascertain the kind, quantity and value of the chattel estate which passed into the hands of Priscilla Branson² late Holmes - how much if any of said chattels were illegally sold by the said Priscilla or Nicholas J. Branson also the kind, quantity and value of said chattels remaining on the 1st day of January 1845 which said Commissioners will report with any others specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or which may be required by any of the parties to be so stated.

But the parties to whom money is directed to be paid by this decree shall not have the benefit thereof till they or some one for them shall respectively call refunding bonds with good security payable to Edwards' administrator of Peter Booth² in a penalty equal to double the amount directed to be paid to them respectively, conditioned to refund their due proportion of any debt which may hereafter be recovered against the estate of Peter Booth² and of the cost of such recovery - one full and complete copy of this Court to be filed by him among the papers in this cause -
