This day also came on to be again heard on the papers formerly read
and on the Reports of James D. Hazard, Benjamin D. Drew and George A. H.
Newson Commissioners appointed to effect the division of the Slaves of Peter
Booth dead and of Commissioner Benjamin Trade in pursuance of a decree of the
Court pronounced at May Term 1843 and there being no objections to said
Reports the Court doth affirm the same and on the petition of Elijah D. Merrill
and Julia Ann his wife by the consent of William F. Everett Comptroller of the
estate of Eliza M. Branch dead and was argued by counsel On Consideration
thereof and by consent of parties the Court doth appoint William F. Hazard
a Commissioner to collect the amount of the hire of the Slaves reported to be
due by his Report and to sell either publicly or privately in his discretion the
chattel estate in the hands of Nicholas F. Barham belonging to the estate of Peter
Booth dead and Report his proceedings to the next Term of this Court. And
by consent of William F. Everett Sheriff and Comptroller of the estate of Eliza
M. Branch the Court doth alter and amend the decree of May Term 1843 as decrees the Commissioners appointed to divide the
Slaves of Peter Booth dead to allot a portion of said Slaves to said Everett Comptroller
of Eliza M. Branch and also so much as decrees Edwards Bull's administrator
de bonis non of Peter Booth dead to pay to said Everett Comptroller at or before
the date of fifteen hundred & thirty eight dollars & thirty cents with
interest at eight hundred forty seven dollars & seventy six cents part thereof
from December 31st 1844 and include thereof doth adverage order and
decrees that Edwards Bull's administrator de bonis non of Peter Booth dead pay
to Elijah D. Merrill and Julia Ann his wife the said sum of fifteen hundred
& thirty eight dollars & thirty three cents with interest at eight hundred and
forty seven dollars & seventy six cents part thereof from December 31st 1844
the said Peter Booth's Merrill wife are not to have the benefit of this
decree against Bull's estate they or some one for them shall enter into bond
and security in a sum equal to double the amount decreed to them
conditioned to refund their due proportions of any suits or demands which may
hereafter appear against the estate of Peter Booth dead and the costs attending
the recovery thereof and William F. Merrill admitting that he has in his
hands the amount which was decreed to the administrator of Eliza M. Branch
being the proportion of money arising from the sale of the Slaves of Peter Booth
dead to wit the sum of five hundred and thirty five dollars and twenty two cents.
The Court doth adverage order and decrees that the said Merrill pay to Elijah D.
Merrill and Julia Ann his wife the said sum of five hundred & thirty five dollars
& twenty two cents with interest from the day and that they execute a receipt
to him therefor And as to all other matters then came to be considered all the
next Term -

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till Monday morning Ten O'clock
