land in the proceedings mentioned since the defendant Henry Joyner, came into the pos-
session of the same and make report thereof to Court with any matters specially stated
deemed pertinent by himself or which any of the parties may require to be stated -

the said Theophilus Barron having been committed to the hands of Samuel D Hines Sheriff
of Southampton, and Robert G Griffen having qualified as Executor of Benjamin
Griffin and the estate of Richard Barron being also now committed to the hands
of Samuel D Hines Sheriff of Southampton County - On motion of the said Samuel
D Hines administrator of the said Theophilus Barron this suit is revived in his
name as plaintiff - And on motion of the said Samuel D Hines and by consent of
Robert G Griffen executor the said suit is revived against him as Executor
of Benjamin Griffin and against the said Samuel D Hines Sheriff and administra-
tor of Richard Barron. And therupon this cause came on by consent of parties
to be heard on the papers formerly read, and on the report of Commissioner Golding
made in October of May 1844 to which report there is no exception and
was argued by Plaintiff's Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court confirming
the report of Commissioner Golding with consent of parties adjudge, order and
decree that Commissioner Golding take a further account of the transactions of
Benjamin Griffin upon the estate of Richard Barron and make report thereof
Court with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or which
any of the parties may require to be so stated.
