Chancery of Southampton County payable to the Plaintiff in the penalty of eight
hundred dollars conditioned to have the said slave forthcoming to abide any
future order or decree of the Court in relation thereto or to pay to the Plaintiff
such sum or sums of money as may be necessary to have the Sheriff of
the said County of Southampton directed to take possession of the said slave
imprisoned above and to have them sent until the said Court, Superior Court
of Law and Chancery for said County taking bond and security for the same to be
payable to the said Sheriff and returned before the same in the cause But the
officer of the injunction is to be suspended until the Plaintiff is done out for loss
shall enter into bond with sufficient security in the said Clerk's office in the penalty
of five hundred dollars conditioned to pay all such costs and damages as may
accuse to or against the defendant, or either of them in consequence of this injunction
