The Motion of the plaintiffs by Counsel who this day filed their bill in
 support of a writ of ^{habeas corpus} and ^{other} ^{reliefs} ^{concerned}
 is awarded to prevent the defendants ^{from removing or carrying or}
 committing to be removed or sent out of the limits of this Commonwealth the slaves
 Jack Palmer, Cherry George, James, Mary, Elizabeth, Harriet, Colton, Mathew,
 Corriea, Green, James, in the City of New York until the further order of the Court,
 and until the said defendants shall enter into bond with sufficient security in
 the Clerk's Office and before the Clerk of the Circuit Superior Court of Law and
 Chancery of Southamption County payable to the plaintiffs in the penalty of eight
 hundred dollars conditioned to have the said slaves forthcoming to abide any
 future order or decree of the Court in relation thereto or to pay to the plaintiff
 such sum or sums of money as may be decreed to them by the Sheriff
 of the said County of Southamption is awarded to take possession of the said slaves
 mentioned above and to have them sent, under the said Clerk, Superior Court
 of Law and Chancery for said County taking bond and security for the same slaves
 payable the said Sheriff and ^{return} ^{and} ^{affile} ^{the} ^{same} ⁱⁿ ^{the} ^{case} ^{that} ^{the}
 officers of the respondent is to be suspended until the plaintiff or some one for him
 shall enter into bond with sufficient security in the said Clerk's Office in the penalty
 of five hundred dollars conditioned to pay all such costs and damages as may
 accrue to or against the defendant, or either of them in consequence of this injunction
