 with interest thereon from the 1<sup>st</sup> of July 1836 until paid and that the  
 Court doth further signify order and decree that the defendants do pay  
 to the plaintiff the costs by him on this behalf expended And  
 liberty is awarded if so the plaintiff to apply hereafter for further relief  
 against the other defendants should the record prove unavailing
