upon the said defendant. Motion of the plaintiff his Bill a return  
for confessed as to the defendants Alexander Meyrich and William W. Butler  
and this cause coming on this day to be heard on the Bill and schedule  
which was argued by counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge  
order and decree that the defendant Benjamin N. Barnes do pay to the  
plaintiff Richard Barnes the sum of twenty seven dollars and twenty one  
cents with interest thereon from the 1<sup>st</sup> of July 1838 until paid and the  
Court doth further adjudge order and decree that the defendants do pay  
to the plaintiff the costs by him at his behalf expended and  
likewise a reward of £10 to the plaintiff to apply thereafter for further relief  
against the other defendants should the same prove unavailing.

This day the cause came on to be finally heard on the papers formerly read  
and on the Report of Commissioner Ebenezer Woods in pursuance of an order  
of this Court pronounced at May Term 1845 to which Report there is no  
exception and on the statement filed March 28<sup>th</sup> and the last conforming  
said Report, doth adjudge order and decree that S. R. Ebenezer out of the sum  
arising from the sale of the land pay to Euse Barnes late Sheriff of  
Plymouth and committee of the estate of Benjamin Turner the sum of six  
hundred and twenty dollars and twenty two cents with interest on five  
hundred and sixty six dollars and forty nine cents till paid to Euse  
Harris five hundred and twelve dollars and twenty three cents with interest  
from the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1844 to Euse Barnes late Sheriff of  
Plymouth with like interest to Howell Harris Executrix of Will of Francis  
two hundred dollars and eight cents with like interest to Eliza Turner one  
dollar and fifty four cent with like interest to Peter Edwards administrator  
of Benjamin Edwards' estate one dollar and thirty seven cents with like interest  
to Henry M. Morris and Nathaniel Francis administrator of Joseph Francis  
one hundred eight dollars and thirty four cent with like interest to John  
Stamps hundred dollars and twenty cents with like interest to Peter R.  
Pleong for Robert Coulter twenty six dollars and twenty eight cents with  
like interest to William H. Hardman eleven dollars and forty eight
