on the special statement of the said Commissioner and Michael O'Connell ^{Special} ~~Special~~ ^{Statement} the last which confirmed. On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge order
and decree that the defendants James Bonwit and Scepter Bonwit pay to the
plaintiff Jacob Bonwit the sum of seven hundred and sixty eight dollars
and eighty three cents with interest thereon from October 6th 1871 till paid
and his costs by him in this case, referred and the said debt further adjudged
order and decree that the Plaintiff of Southampton sell in the highest bidder for
