the exception to the Report of Commissioner Goodenough ^{made in a return} pursuant to the order at the November Term 1874 and
on the special statement of the said Commissioner and Mark S. Bates ^{Special Statement} which the Court doth confirm. On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge order
and decree that the defendants James Benoit and Joseph Benoit pay to the
plaintiff Jacob Benoit the sum of three hundred and sixty eight dollars
and eighty three cents with interest thereon from October 6th 1871 till paid
and his costs by him in this suit, expended and the Court doth further adjudge
order and decree that the Plaintiff of Southampton sell in the highest bidder for
cash after giving thirty days notice of the time place of sale the undivided
interest of Joseph Benoit being one fourth part in the Slave and Slave concerns

(if necessary) set apart and allot one half of the lands in the bill mentioned
