on the amended answer of Martha B. Rockwell and application thereto together with
the Report of Commissioners foregoing made under an order of May Term 1844 to
which the exception was filed ^{and} the State of Massachusetts, and was argued by
counsel on Consideration whereof the Court confirming the said Report and refusing
to opinion as to the merits of the defendant Martha B. Rockwell in the estate
left her former husband Henry Gray as survivor of her second husband James
Rockwell but reserving that question for further argument date or an adjournment
thereby counsel of parties that the defendant Martha B. Rockwell executor of
the estate of her former husband Henry Gray be directed to pay unto the plaintiff John Taylor or the sum five hundred
and thirty seven dollars and twelve cents with interest one year hundred and
thirty seven dollars paid therefrom the 1st day of January 1833, or twenty four dollars
paid therefrom the 1st day of January 1833 and one thirty one dollars and
seventy five cents paid therefrom the 1st day of January 1848 left unpaid and
that the said defendant Martha B. Rockwell pay unto the defendant John W.
Rockwell the like sum of five hundred and thirty seven dollars and twelve cents
with interest on like amount as above stated. It is earnestly desired by
counsel of parties that George W. Hinman Benjamin Drury James D. Bryant
and George Boutwell any three of whom shall be and shall be hereby appointed
Commissioners for that purpose to divide the estate belonging to the estate
of Henry A. Gray deceased and between the parties of the defendant Martha
B. Rockwell into eight equal parts having regard to value and all other
parts to the plaintiff John Taylor for and one part to the defendant John W.
