

This day the cause came on to be tried by counsel of parties with the bill amended bill and exhibits filed therewith the answers of the infant defendants William F. Donnell administrator de bono non with the will annexed of Green & Branch and Thomas J. and Jane Prindle executors and executrix of Thomas F. Feltow decd and replications thereto and was argued by counsel On Consideration whereof the Court doth order that a Commission of the Court and of the State and under the following account to wit 1st An Account of the transaction of Thomas Feltow as administrator of Green & Branch 2nd An account of William F. Donnell as administrator of the said Branch 3rd An account of the outstanding debts against the estate of Green & Branch distinguishing between the specialty debts which bind the heirs and simple contracts debts 4th An account of the annual and real value of the Land now belonging to the estate of said Branch which remains unpaid 5th An account of the debts against said Branches estate which have been paid distinguishing the debts which bound the heirs and the simple contracts debts and also specifying the debts paid out of the funds received from the Land sold in the bill mentioned with that the said Commissioners Report the same to Court together with any matter specially stated which the Court think necessary or which any of the parties may require him to so state

This day the cause came on again to be heard on the papers formerly made on the annual answer of Martha B. Rockwell and Replications thereto together with the Report of Commissioners Goodwyns made under an order of May Term 1841 to which the exceptions have been filed ^{only} the statement made by the Court and was argued by counsel On Consideration whereof the Court confirming the said Report and expressing its opinion as to the nature of the defendant Martha B. Rockwell in the estate left her former husband Thomas Eliza a survivor of her second husband James Rockwell but reserving that question for future decision doth order as follows and decree by counsel of parties that the defendant Martha B. Rockwell receiver of and out of the estate of the said James Rockwell pay unto the plaintiff John Tyler the sum five hundred and thirty seven dollars and twelve cents with interest on four hundred and thirty seven dollars paid thirty four days of January 1833 or twenty five dollars paid thirty four days of January 1833 and on thirty one dollars and twenty five cents paid thirty four days of January 1848 till paid and that the said defendant Martha B. Rockwell pay unto the defendant John B. Rockwell the like sum of five hundred and thirty seven dollars and twelve cents with interest on like amount as above stated That said debt further order by counsel of parties that George & W. Newsome Benjamin Drayton James D. Bygones and George Eliza any three of whom act as and they have knowledge appointed Commissioners for that purpose proceed to divide the same amongst the estate of Thomas F. Feltow deceased and retain the possession of the defendant Martha B. Rockwell the right equal parts having regard to value and all other parts in the plaintiff John Tyler for and on part is the defendant John B.

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
